1. MUTH 5322 Score Reading, MUHS 4803/4813 Survey of Keyboard Literature, and MUPD 4863 Piano Pedagogy are not offered every semester and should be taken when offered during the sophomore, junior or senior years.
2. MUTH 1003 Basic Musicianship does not count toward the 21 hours of required theory (or as a free elective); entering students will take a diagnostic exam and may not be required to take the course.
3. Satisfactory completion of the term paper in this class will fulfill the Fulbright College writing requirement.
4. Prerequisites for enrollment in MUAP 310V include passage of the Junior Barrier (generally taken at the end of the sophomore year); and performances on two Student Recitals.
5. The ensemble requirements as listed are typical; substitutions are possible - check with an advisor.
