- 1 MUTH 1003 Basic Musicianship does not count toward the 21 hours of required theory (or as a free elective); entering students will take a diagnostic exam and may not be required to take the course.
- 2 Satisfactory completion of the term paper in this class will fulfill the Fulbright College writing requirement. The graded paper must be submitted with a completed form to the music office.
- 3 MUTH 4322 Score Reading, MUHS 4803/4813 Survey of Keyboard Literature, and MUPD 4863 Piano Pedagogy are not offered every semester and should be taken when offered during the sophomore, junior or senior years.
- 4 Prerequisites for enrollment in MUAP 310V include completing 4 semesters of MUAP 110V/210V with a grade of "A" or "B", passing the Junior Barrier (generally taken at the end of the sophomore year) and performing twice at Wednesday Recital Hour.
- 5 The ensemble requirements as listed are typical; substitutions are possible - check with an advisor.
