## PERSONNEL

The Lyrique Quintette is a highly-regarded woodwind quintet with over 30 years of concertizing, touring, presenting, and mentoring. The quintet is dedicated to commissioning and performing new music and music by diverse composers. The ensemble has performed extensively in the United States and abroad, including tours in Germany, Thailand, Canada, and Spain, including a concerto appearance with the Thai National Orchestra and an invited performance by the United States Embassy in Madrid. The quintet's recent album, Arrivals and Departures: Music of the Americas, has been favorably reviewed, and includes two works commissioned by the quintet. Clarinet Journal described the quintet as "enthusiastically endorsed," and the Art Music Lounge stated that "every instrument was perfectly placed to achieve maximum clarity and a perfect ensemble blend."

As quintet-in-residence at the University of Arkansas, the ensemble is committed to music education, and has made hundreds of visits to schools, giving master classes and workshops and performing to inspire the next generation of young musicians.
