PROGRAM NOTES

Concerto in F Minor for Tuba and Orchestra. British composer Ralph Vaughan Williams wrote the tuba concerto in 1954 for London tubist, Philip Catelinet, who premiered it in June of 1954 with Sir John Barbirolli conducting the London Symphony Orchestra. Though initially considered an eccentric oddity by a composer in his 80s, the work soon became one of the composer's most highly regarded works and has become the cornerstone of the modern tubist's repertoire.

Tubist Henry Sargent, the performer of this evening's performance, is a graduate student in tuba performance at the University of Arkansas, studying with Dr. Ben Pierce. He was the winner of the 2024 Concerto-Aria contest.

Ethiopa's Shadow in America. Written by American composer Florence Price in 1932, Ethiopa's Shadow in America is a three-movement orchestral work depicting the African American experience in America, from the arrival of the first slaves in 1619 through the turbulent Jim Crow era and into the 1930s. She entitled the three movements: I. Introduction and Allegretto: The Arrival of the Negro in America when first brought here as a slave; II. Andante: His Resignation and Faith; III. Allegro: His Adaptation. Though trained at the New England Conservatory in a traditional European style, her mentors George Chadwick in Boston and later the Chicago composer Leo Sowerby encouraged her to incorporate the rhythms, melodies and harmonic structure of the Negro Spiritual into her output. The music to this work was lost for many decades, only to be rediscovered in 2009 in the attic of a small house just outside of St. Anne, Illinois. The house had been bought by Ms. Price and used as a summer home until her death in 1953.

Chichester Psalms. Leonard Bernstein composed the Chichester Psalms in 1965, after being commissioned by a music festival to be held at the Cathedral of Chichester, in Sussex, England. The world premiere actually took place on July 15, 1965, in Philharmonic Hall, N.Y., with the composer conducting the New York
