Home to over 300 music students and fifty faculty members, we offer a variety of degree programs at the undergraduate and graduate levels.



PROGRAM NOTES

PECOS SINGER

Singer received Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from the University of Oregon and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Maryland. He has appeared as cello soloist with the San Francisco Conservatory Baroque Ensemble and the Santa Fe Youth Symphony, and as principal cellist he has performed with the Arkansas Philharmonic Orchestra, The Orchestra Now (TON), the University of Maryland Symphony, the Avanti Orchestra, the Londontowne Symphony Orchestra, and the San Fransisco Conservatory Baroque Ensemble. He joined the faculty of the University of Arkansas this past August and this marks his first appearance with the USO.

NOCTURNE

Tchaikovsky composed this Nocturne in 1873 and published it as No. 4 in his Six Pieces for Piano, Op. 19. A few years later the cellist Wilhelm Fitzenhagen made a transcription for cello and piano and in February of 1888 Anatoly Brandukov premiered Tchaikovsky's arrangement for cello and orchestra at a concert in Paris.

SYMPHONY NO. 8

Beethoven wrote the 8th symphony in just two months time near the end of summer, 1812 (the same year the more famous 7th appeared). Though not adored by contemporary audiences it has always enjoyed a quiet appreciation among many critics, including George Bernard Shaw and Jan Swafford, who delighted in the simple yet complex construction, the use of humor and irony, and above all, the many sudden shifts in mood and dynamics.
